



## Missouri names OU's Eich CPOY

Ohio University student Matt Eich has been named the 2006 College Photographer of the Year, in the annual competition sponsored by the University of Missouri.

Judges selected the award-winning pieces from more than 12,500 image submissions by undergraduate and graduate students. Fourteen Ohio University students, all from the School of Visual Communication, earned 25 awards.

## Schaeffer E&P winner again

Patricia Schaeffer, staff photographer at The Morning Journal in Lisbon won an honorable mention in Editor & Publisher's 7th Annual Photos of the Year contest sponsored by Canon.

The contest's four categories: news, feature, sports and photo essay are judged based on circulation with one winner and one honorable mention selected in each category.

The win is the third for Schaeffer in the E&P contest, winning in the feature category 2001 and sports in 2003.

This year's grand prize went to Thomas James Hurst of the Seattle Times. Hurst's winning image was taken in Puthian, Pakistan, following a magnitude-7.6 earthquake that claimed more than 80,000 lives.

Both Schaeffer and Hurst previously worked at The (Youngstown) Vindicator. Schaeffer was a staffer for many years, while Hurst was in intern while a student at San Francisco State.


