the world ranging from natural disasters, international conflicts to the Olympics. His approach to aerial photography has been singled out as one of the most unique amongst photographers today.

Beth Reynolds specializes in black and white photo-documentaries. Her recent documentaries report on daycare in America, welfare moms and survivors of breast and cervical cancer. She is coordinator of the photography/digital program at The Arts Center, St. Petersburg and photographer laureate for the City of Tampa.

Karl Kuntz, managing editor of The Columbus Dispatch, is an expert and teacher in digital imaging. He has been co-chair of several of the national Visual Edge conferences on digital imaging, sponsored by the National Press Photographers Association & the Poynter Institute for Media Studies.



LEVY TAKES THE 5TH

HARWOOD WINS OHIO UNDERSTANDING AWARD, FALKENBERG STUDENT POY

The number five was not only special this year to the Pittsburgh Steelers, it was also special to Mike Levy and the photo staff at The Plain Dealer.

Just as the Steelers won their fifth Super Bowl championship in February, Levy, a staff photographer at the Cleveland paper, added his fifth Photographer of the Year title after being named the state's top shooter at the 55th Ohio News Photographers Association Pictures of the Year competition.

The photo staff at the Cleveland newspaper not only captured three of the four places in the Photographer of the Year category (Gus Chan placed third and Dale Omori received an Award of Excellence), they were named the best photography staff in the over 100,000 circulation category for the sixth consecutive year.

The paper swept the three top spots in last year's contest.

Individually, their staff won 35 of the 90 awards given in the 14 categories they competed in, including seven first place awards. Andrea Levy renewed her individual domination of the Issue Illustration category by collecting all five places awarded in the category.

"What's great about Mike and the entire PD photography staff," explained Plain Dealer DOP Bill Gugliotta, "is that, even though most of them are mid-career professionals, they still get excited about pictures and are still growing as photojournalists. We're very proud of Mike and the entire photography and picture editing staff."

"For Mike to win the POY a fifth time (his previous wins came in 1991, 1998, 2000, 2001) is a great

accomplishment and well-deserved," continued Gugliotta. "We're very lucky to have Mike at the Plain Dealer. His photography resonates with readers because of it's powerful emotional appeal. Mike's pictures are never dull or routine and he always finds a

way to make a picture that surprises you. It's hard to feel indifferent about his pictures; there's usually something there that's evocative and hits you in the gut"

Free lance photographer and Kent State University graduate Greg Ruffing finished second to Levy in the POY category. It was the second time Ruffing was the POY runner-up, the last time being in 2003.

Kent State University Press photographer Gary Harwood took home the James R. Gordon Ohio Understanding Award for his entry "Growing Season: Life of a Migrant Community"

124 photographers from across the state submitted 1,937 entries in this year's competition. 49 photographers (an increase of 15 from last year) entered the POY competition.

The contest, which rewards the best in news photography from around the state, was held at Taylor Hall on the campus of Kent State University. Judges for the contest were Jeanie Adams-Smith, Associate Professor of Photojournalism at Western Kentucky University, Cliff Schiappa, Associated Press Regional Photo Editor for the Midwest Region based in Kansas City, Missouri and Brian Peterson, a staff photographer and photo coach for the Minneapolis Star-Tribune.

The judges were impressed not only the quality of the work entered, but the number of entries in the competition. "The overall quality is as good as anything I've seen," said Adams-Smith. "The level of the work was extraordinarily high," continued Schiappa. "They (the photographers) are a talented bunch." On a negative note, all three were extremely critical of the lack of complete captions on many of the entries, some that failed to place due lack of information such as names. "There is no excuse for not having that basic information," said Adams-Smith.

All three agreed it was difficult trying to decide between the very high caliber of the entries in several categories, especially general news ("Ohio can shoot some news", said Adams-Smith) and sports action ("There are dozens of shots we rejected that I would love to have on a daily basis," exclaimed Schiappa.

All three were impressed with the quality of the entries in the spot news under category. "These are some great photos for small papers," said Peterson.

Levy is a graduate of Ohio University who joined the PD staff in 1991. His three stories, 9 singles portfolio was singled out, according to the judges, "for great storytelling, good subjects that had more meat to the photos, and a visual sophistication."

Individually, Levy collected first and third place awards in the general news category, second place in the assigned feature category, first place in the feature picture, second and third place awards in news picture story and a award of excellence in the sports

action category.

The judges all agreed that Harwood's Ohio Understanding entry titled "Growing Season: The Life of a Migrant Community" was an amazing piece of work. "Everything about this essay is perfect," said Adam-Smith, "and it is a terrific example of finding stories about Ohio and covering them."

Harwood was granted access to the 130 agricultural migrant camps in the Hartville, Ohio area in 2001 and he spent the next five years documenting the broad legal, economic and social realities of migrant issues.

I was pleased when I heard I had won the Ohio Understanding Award," said Harwood. "It is the result you hope for when you spend five years on one story. It is very competitive with many talented photographers entering powerful stories," continued Harwood, "I am excited about this opportunity and honored to have won this award.

Andrea Levy's sweep of the top five places in the Issue Illustration category pushed her win streak to 22 of the last 23 places in the category. The judges praised her work for taking the issues and pushing her work to illustrate them beyond normal images.

Katie Falkenberg, graduate student from Ohio University, won the student POY fol-lowed by Kent State University's Emily Rasisnski. Ohio University students Michael P. King placed third and Sung H. Jun received an Award of Excellence.

Falkenberg's portfolio was comprised of

photos made in Athens and the surrounding area with the exception of a sheep farming story taken while participating in the Scotland Field School in Documentary Photojournalism.

A second story in her porfolio about a female boxer from Glouster, Ohio placed second in the sports picture story category. Falkenberg also won awards of excellence in the assigned feature and general news cate-

Prior to graduate school Fakenberg interned in Washington, DC for Scripps Howard News Service. The political beat was so much to her liking that she stayed in Washington and became a freelance photographer mainly covering the White House and Capitol Hill for The New York Times and

European Pressphoto Agency.

The Repository was named Staff of the Year for newspapers in the under 100,000 circulation division. The Springfield News-Sun placed second in both Staff of the Year and Picture Usage categories, while the Gazette in Medina finished third in the staff category. The News-Herald took top honors in the Picture Usage under 100,000 category.

The Columbus Dispatch and Dayton Daily News took second and third to round out the Staff of the Year (over 100,000) category. In the Picture Usage (over 100,000) category, The Columbus Dispatch placed second, the Akron Beacon Journal finished third, while the Dayton Daily News received an Award of Excellence.

Still clip rules

Photos must be entered in the month published. A photo can be entered only after its initial publication. Publication is defined as printed or electronically reproduced by your publication's official

All Web published entries must be in the form of a hard copy no larger than 8 by 10 inches, with a screen shoot of the picture's online publication on the back.

Submissions of wire photos will be handled similarly. If a clip of your AP submission is not available a print no larger than 8 by 10 inches may be entered. Attached must be a proof from your AP server of the photo or the routing code and date of transmission.

Remove your name and affiliation from the front of the clip. Affix a completed official entry label on the back. Include a separate sheet of paper with your name, address and total number of clips entered.

Lavouts are judged as a single entry but single pictures from a

Layouts are judged as a single entry but single pictures from a layout can be entered also. You must submit another clip of the single image from the layout in this case.

Sort clips by category: Spot news: A picture of an unscheduled event for which no advanced planning was possible. Examples: fires, accidents and natural disas-

General news: A picture of a scheduled political, social or cultural event for which advance planning was possible. An assigned and/or scheduled news event. Example: Demonstrations, funerals, trials and promotional events.

Portrait: A picture of a person that reveals the essence of the subject's

character.

Sports: An unposed sports-related picture, either feature or action. Sports-related portraits should be entered in the portrait category. Feature single: A general human-interest photo.

Multiple pictures: A photo story, sequence or series of any subject

matter.

Illustration: A created picture, not a found situation or portrait. Intended to clarify or dramatize a preconceived idea. This would include illustrations depicting food, fashion, industrial or editorial topics. This category will be judged quarterly but clips must be entered in the month published.

Each entrant is limited to a total of nine clips per month. The clip contest is open to all ONPA members in good standing who live or work in Ohio during the month entered. The ONPA clip contest is not affiliated with the NPPA Region 4 clip contest. Clips must be in the hand of the clip chairman by the 7th of the month following publication. Clips should be sent to

Submitting winning clips

All winners in the monthly clip contest must submit a copy of the winning entry for the ONPA newsletter and/or web site. Winners will be notified via e-mail, so remember to include your e-mail address on the back of each clip. If you do not respond to the first notification in seven days a second notice will be sent. Failure to respond to the second notice in ten days will result in a loss of points for that clip with the second notice in ten days will result in a loss of points for that clip win. If in subsequent months the same photographer fails to reply he or she will be disqualified from entering the contest for the remainder of the year.

First place winners should be 10 inches widest measurement @ 200 dpi. 2nd, 3rd, HM: winners should be 7 inches widest measure @ 72 dpi. Files should be slugged accordingly: month_category_place.jpg Example: May_genews_1st.jpg


